**The BEST way I have found to get the exact spot to submit to our map:**

**Go to Google and log in (you have to, to be able to get to a certain function);**

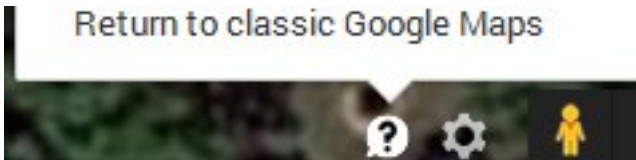
**Go to Google Maps in map mode, zoom in to the QTH;**

**Once you get close, switch to Satellite view and zoom all the way in;**

**Down in the bottom right is a circle with a ? in it:**



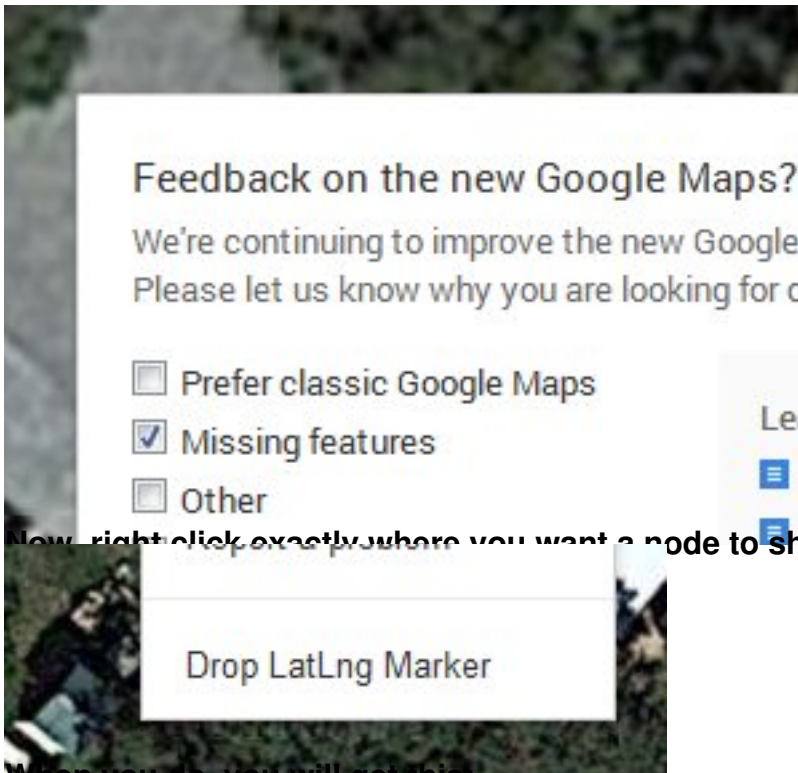
**Click it and select "Return to Classic Google maps" (I always check the "Missing Features" box);**

Now, right click exactly where you want a node to show, select "Drop LatLng Marker";



When you do, you will get this:



You can highlight the field in that marker with a mouse:



Right click on the field in that marker with a mouse, and select "Copy" (or "Copy Coordinates" if you have that option). This will copy the coordinates to the clipboard, as
